
































WHO's Vision






A world in which all people attain the highest possible standard of health and well-being.

Is rooted in the 1948 constitution

CHAPTER I - OBJECTIVE

Article 1

The objective of the World Health Organization (hereinafter called the Organization) shall be the attainment by all peoples of the highest possible level of health.



Programme Budget Appropriation Resolution 72.1

In resolution WHA72.1, the 72nd World Health Assembly in May 2019;

- Approved the Programme budget for 2020-21
- Requested the Director-General, inter alia, to continue developing the results framework of the Thirteenth General Programme of Work, 2019–2023 (GPW13) in consultation with Member States, including through the regional committees.
- To present it to the Executive Board at its 146th session in January 2020.












WHO Impact Framework







Universal Health Coverage Index




Health Emergencies Billion




1 billion people better protected from health emergencies

Additional impact indicators

- Proportion of vulnerable people in fragile settings provided with essential health services
- Number of deaths, missing persons and directly affected persons attributed to disasters per 100 000 population

The Emergencies Index






Detect and respond indicator

Level 1: <30
Level 2: 30-<50
Level 3: 50-<70
Level 4: 70-<90
Level 5: ≥90

- The emergencies index will range from 0 (no protection) to 100 (perfect protection) and will be banded into 5 levels
- No country is at level 5
- Level 1 & 2 contribute to 2.8 billion


Update on Healthier Population Billion


Healthier Populations Index*


Country contribution to the global triple billion targets
